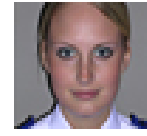

Your Priorities - What you told us

- Anti-social Behaviour – Dalston/ Cummersdale.
- Speeding – All Villages.

Your Priorities - What we did

Anti-social behaviour

We have continued to receive complaints, albeit in small numbers, in respect of Anti social behaviour involving young people in Dalston and Cummersdale.

Following receipt of these complaints we -

- Liaised with local youth clubs and schools.
- Held a meeting with tenancy enforcement officers from Riverside Housing Association regarding issues in Cummersdale
- Made a number of home visits to interview young people responsible for Anti social behaviour in Dalston.
- We have increased our visible police patrols in the area at appropriate times spending time speaking with the young people in the area

Speeding Vehicles

We have continued to target speeding in the local areas by-

- Targeted high visibility patrolling of priority routes
- A number of speeders have been caught by use of the radar speed gun resulting in the issue of two £60 endorsable fixed penalty notices and one driver reported who will be summonsed to court.
- A driver has also been reported for driving without due care and attention after a road traffic accident which can be directly attributable to excess speed.
- During the winter months road conditions can deteriorate quite quickly. We advise drivers to slow down and drive in accordance with the prevailing conditions at the time. It is also advisable for drivers to regularly check their vehicles to ensure they are safe to drive for this time of year. A number of vehicles have been stopped and Vehicle defect rectification scheme notices issued for defective lights.

Crime In Your Area - Follow Up

Thefts

Over the last month there has been no particular discernable pattern of types of crime being committed on the Caldew area. There have been a number of opportunistic thefts along with targeted thefts whereby the offenders have been looking for specific items at specific locations. There have also been a number of incidents of damage for which there does not appear to be any particular reason for. These crimes have been committed throughout the Caldew area and not in greater numbers in any particular parish. The number of burglaries being committed has reduced but at this time of the year I would ask all residents to be vigilant as traditionally there is usually an increase in the number of crimes being committed in the run up to Christmas. Quite often a few simple crime prevention measures can greatly reduce the risk of becoming a victim of crime. However we would like to reassure you that the Caldew area is still a low crime area. The Cumbria Constabulary website contains advice on a variety of crime prevention topics. Please contact us if you could like more information or if you would like to join one of the Farm watch or Neighborhood watch schemes in your area.

Caldew Community engagement

On Monday 26th October PC Hird attended the Dalston and Cummersdale Neighbourhood Forum at Great Orton village hall. There he met local residents and representatives from the Parish and City councils along with representatives from local groups. He gave an update on the planned police surgeries to be held throughout the Caldew community area and the reintroduction of the mobile police station to visit the more outlying villages. This will allow residents who do not have access to vehicles or public transport the opportunity to meet with the local community officer to discuss any local issues. These are to be run alongside 'drop ins' to other community groups to maximise community contact with local residents. When finalized, dates will be publicised on local notice boards, Cumbria Constabulary website and if available your local parish council website.

On 16th December between 12-1400 we will be at Scotby Village Hall where we will be asking for your assistance to set our forthcoming priorities based on what you feel are the policing issues or concerns affecting your area. Please come along and have your say.
