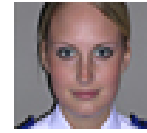

### Your Priorities - What we did

#### Anti-social behaviour

We are continuing to monitor ASB in Dalston and Cummersdale after recent complaints. It is one of our local priorities and we have done the following to combat this problem-

- Increased Patrols in the evenings and weekends.
- Liaised with youth clubs and schools.
- Contacted local housing associations to discuss issues

We have also:-

- Sent letters to the parents of youths involved in anti social behaviour and made personal visits as necessary.
- Conducted searches of people and vehicles suspected of drugs misuse

We will continue to take positive action against those persons who act in an anti social manner. Please continue to report any unacceptable behaviour

#### Speeding Vehicles

We continue to monitor the speeding in the local areas by-

- Targeted patrolling of priority routes with both use of radar devices and also high visibility police presence
- During September 7 drivers were issued with endorsable fixed penalties for speeding, 2 drivers were given conditional offers of a speed awareness course and 1 driver summonsed to court.
- The Camera Safety Unit has also targeted the Green, Dalston on a number of occasions during September

There have been 6 reported road traffic collisions on the roads in the Caldew area during September. Please drive responsibly and carefully and ensure you and your family complete your journey safely.

### Crime In Your Area - Follow Up

#### Thefts

There has been a change in the type of burglaries committed on the Caldew area over the last month. The emphasis has shifted from farms towards outbuildings/compounds. Criminals operating in the Caldew area are targeting gardening equipment and tools. This shift may be a result of the crime prevention work which has been carried out at many farms within our area. Over the last month there have also been 5 vehicle related crimes reported. There appears to be no obvious link or pattern to these incidents. We ask that members of the public continue to be vigilant in an effort to both prevent offences happening and to catch the criminals that commit them.

#### Caldew Community engagement

On the 15<sup>th</sup> of September members of the Caldew Neighbourhood policing team brought the mobile police station to the Square at Dalston. We met with members of the public and discussed a variety of issues.

We are currently in the process of arranging patch walks in a number of areas during which we will be seeking your views on what you feel are problems in your area.

PCSO Tonge, PC Hird and PC Taylor will also be making informal visits to clubs and community groups in your village. During these visits feel free to discuss any issues you may have, obtain advice or just have a general chat.
