EMERGENCY INFORMATION (MARCH 2024)

Dalston (OS grid reference NY 395555) is a large parish of 11,900 acres and 2590 residents (2011), with small hamlets and isolated farms around the village which contains two of the three schools in the parish, the main industries and the transport hub. It lies 5 miles south of Carlisle on the B5299 and 5 miles from J42 on M6 and there are several roads into the village, a railway line, footpaths, and a cycleway. Mobile phone reception is not good, but there are medical facilities (a GP practice with a dispensary, a pharmacy, and a dentist); hospitality (hotel, a pub, a café, sandwich shop and fish and chip shop); and retail (large Co-op convenience store and butchers).

There is a good community spirit with many groups and activities including several for elderly / very young (i.e., vulnerable).

Joyce from the Country Kitchen Café (01228 711431) delivers meals to many elderly/vulnerable people. The Caldew Club (Julia Higgins 01228 711347), Dalston W.I. (Janet Wright 01228 711098), and Cumdivock W.I. (Mandy Henderson 01228 710282) have many older members. Caldew School (01228 710044) has Secondary age students; St Michaels, Dalston (01228 711544) and Raughton Head (016974 76291) have Primary pupils; and Pre-School children attend Buggy Parade at Dalston Methodist Church (Margery Little 01228 711548), St Michael's Pre-School Nursery at Recreation Centre (Jo Short 01228 712000), Abacus Day Nursery on Barras Lane Industrial Estate (Alison or Zoe 01228 712888), Gaitsgill Parents and Toddlers, Primrose Hall, Gaitsgill (Alexandra 07923 378547 or Joanna 07746 846837).

All major emergencies are dealt with by the Emergency Services, Local Authorities, Health Agencies, Utility Companies and Voluntary Agencies in a combined response listed at www.cumbria.gov.uk>crfpartners. There is no statutory responsibility for community groups, such as Parish Councils, to plan for, or respond to, an emergency in their locality. However, it is good practice for communities to identify hazards and make simple plans to assist these agencies.

It should be recognized that community groups are not an emergency service. They will not be trained, equipped, empowered, resourced, or insured to carry out the functions of an emergency service. Any volunteers who are off-duty members of an emergency service should report to that service rather than acting independently and be aware that injured volunteers are the last thing wanted. Community groups should be informing and caring for parishioners and helping to maintain the infrastructure.

POSSIBLE EMERGENCIES

War; Sellafield nuclear accident / terrorist attack.

Major transport accident: rail or road carrying hazardous materials; coach containing school children; air crash.

Industrial accident: BP oil storage depot; Nestle; Barras Lane Industrial Estate.

Health: Food poisoning; pandemics.

Fire: especially one producing noxious fumes.

Weather: storm, snow, ice, rain and flooding.

Communication failure: (no landline, mobile, internet; possibly caused by cyber attack).*

Civil unrest

Catastrophic loss of supplied, distributed, and delivered public utilities, medium to long term, i.e

Electricity, Potable Water, Gas, Kerosine (heating oil) Petrol/Diesel (fuel for agricultural and personal use. These elements could be as a result of any of the above risks but in themselves could be considered catastrophic to The Parish as a whole.

*One Parish Councillor is a licenced radio amateur and could be vital in this circumstance, giving access to RAYNET.
